The museum houses an extensive collection of classical and contemporary art. The collection of old art includes medieval sculptures, and paintings from the South Netherlands and Italy dating back to the 16th and 17th centuries. Showpieces include sculptures created by Jan van Steffenswert, a local woodcarver from Maastricht. In addition, you can admire a sizeable collection of contemporary art from internationally renowned artists as well as temporary high-profile exhibitions. During the 1.5 hour-long tour, the guide will take you through the museum, telling you all you need to know about these works of art. A visit to this art museum, which continues to move on the cutting edge of tradition and innovation, is most certainly worth your time.
